- NEIS stands for ...
  - National Education Information System
  - A Web-based integrated administration system for Korea's education organizations
    - 16 Metropolitan and Provincial Offices of Education
    - 182 Local Offices of Education
    - 11,302 Schools(Elementary, Middle, High, and Special Schools)



#### **□** Goal

- Improving efficiency, transparency and convenience in education administration
  - Reducing the workload of teachers
  - Standardizing 2,272 document formats and work processes
  - Amending 22 laws and regulations
- Providing an easy access & high quality of education service to citizens
  - Parent service
  - Home-Edu Service
  - Public Announcement

#### ■ Scopes

- General affairs, since Oct. 2002
  - Handling general administration jobs for teaching and nonteaching staffs
  - Composed of 17 working areas
- School affairs, since Mar. 2003
  - Handling student information and school administration jobs
  - Composed of 6 working areas
- Civil services
  - Home-Edu (2003)
  - Parent Service (2005)
  - Public Announcements of all schools(2008)



■ Estimation of cost reduction by reduced work (as of 2005)


School Affairs : 74.8B/year

#### ☐ Estimation of cost reduction of Academic Affairs






☐ Inconvenience and discontent

- Duplication of document management(NEIS digital document and Paper document): 32.2%
  - Adopting E-Approval system
- Low speed : 31.0%
- Lots of data items to input: 15.6%
- Difficulties of system usage: 13.8%
- Difficulties of correcting input data: 7.5%

#### ■Adopting E-approval system

- Job burden in managing paper documents and handling NEIS: 32.2%(Dec. 2005)
- Standardizing e-document formats and electronic approval processes
- Implementing an e-approval system and providing guidelines (82 e-approvals out of 165 documents, 2009)

 Adoption rate of E-approval System: 11,039 schools (95.4%, Dec. 2006)



- Degree of satisfaction (Dec. 2006)
  - Electronic documents(paperless): 53.7%
  - Unified working process through NEIS: 50.2%
  - Spending more time in teaching their students: 46.7%
    - Effect on quality of education
- Degree of satisfaction from job reduction at school
  - 29.2%(Jun. 2005)
  - 50.2%(Dec. 2006)
  - 77.7% (Dec. 2008)


- 1. Requiring a student's data
- 2. Arranging the student's data
- Getting an E-approval for releasing the student's data
- 4. Receiving the student's data
- 5. Getting an E-approval for accepting a new students
- 6. Creating new student records at NEIS

  - Before NEIS: 60 minutes → After NEIS: 30 minutes(2006)




#### ☐ Grade analysis process
